MONTHLY REPORTS TO THE COMMUNITY

Maintenance Projects

It is winter but the maintenance projects continue....

- A committee has been formed to look into options to resolve the brown water issue.
- When security lighting is completed at south side entrance, the door will be made available for resident use.
- North fence was measured and approved for removal and replacement. As soon as the materials come in from order the work will be done.
- South fence spindles that were damaged have been replaced. Replacement of the commercial gate was approved and it will be replaced with a gate to match the existing fence.
- Back of building exterior project continues, even through the winter, and will be

- completed in time for our pool deck enjoyment.
- LED lighting has been approved but awaiting information about the Con Edison rebate.
- Ongoing building maintenance.

MONTHLY FINANCIAL REPORT

The Greystone continues to be financially sound. Although a 3% increase was necessary due to increase in various costs and services, our reserve is growing and our taxes are in our tax escrow account ready to pay when it comes time. We have enough money in our operating account to cover any ongoing daily expenses as they arise. All shareholders will receive their monthly financial statement in approximately a week, when it becomes available. There will be a meeting with GDC for the entire community that will take place in the Greystone community room on Thurs. Feb. 20th. This will be a meeting for not only Greystone residents but representatives from the neighboring buildings that will be affected by the tentative plans that Ginsberg Development has for the Metro North Parking lot at Greystone Station. The plan is to build a three level garage, the bottom level for local residents and the top two levels for residents of the 77 apartment building that he is planning to rest on top of the 3-level garage. This will affect parking, traffic, population density and will not be a benefit to The Greystone Community, nor the surrounding community, whether rental, coop or condo. In a cooperative one has an interest and shares in the entire building and has a contract/lease that allows us to occupy our units. A Board of Directors is elected to make decisions to run and care for the building in the name of the shareholders.

It is now approaching that time of year to start thinking about the upcoming May elections to fill 4 vacant seats on our Board of Directors. In approximately two months' time we will be receiving information, asking those who are interested in serving our community as a board member to send in a resume to be placed on the ballot for election.

My mantra, "Building The Greystone Community Together" focuses on the fact that we are a community, "one for all, all for one". It takes blood, sweat and tears to create community. We may not agree with everything that is decided but to become community it takes listening, discussing and finally compromising to do what is best for the total community. We also have guidelines which help us fulfill this shared community living and these are spelled out in the Proprietary Lease and our House Rules. Compactor Rooms

We live in community at the Greystone. So, in consideration of each other *PLEASE* do the following so we do not attract rodents, roaches or other critters when disposing of our garbage. Your participation will be most appreciated.

- ✓ All garbage <u>MUST</u> be bagged and tied before putting into the chute. <u>Push</u> bagged garbage down the chute before closing the door.
- ✓ Please break down cereal boxes (Costco size) and to put in the bin,
- Pizza boxes must be broken down and thrown down the chute.
- ✓ Do not leave large items and large bags of plastic bottles in compactor room, place in the halls near the laundry rooms.

Driving through Garage

✓ Speed limit in garage is 10 MPH. It is very dangerous to speed through the garage.
