It was the coldest Christmas Eve in years, and people were expecting family, cooking for Christmas, and preparing for a cozy, holiday and suddenly we were left with no heat, no hot water and no stove. What a nightmare! However, the majority of our community did not complain, made the best of things and looked out for their neighbors whom they knew were alone or taking care of a spouse with medical issues. It was heartwarming to see how our Greystone Community rose to the situation. In addition, our management and Max, whom had their own Christmas events, gave up everything to spend time in the cold basement, working on the boilers and travelling to Manhattan, more than once, to get parts and fuses that were needed to get the heat and hot water working so that the holiday wouldn't be a total loss. They worked through the night, into the next day, and at least we are in a much better situation. Our gas will be a problem, as Con Edison turned it off and, in order to turn it back on, the valves in every apartment will need to be checked to see that they are up to code. The situation is not yet over, but, as we enter a new year we should think about what is really important in life and put things in their proper prospective.

MONTHLY REPORTS TO THE COMMUNITY

Maintenance Projects

- ✓ The boiler project is ongoing but nearing completion. The project has been delayed due to Con Ed's delay in providing gas service to the boilers and a problem with the pumps, but it is expected that once these issues are corrected the boiler project will be completed within a few weeks.
- ✓ The garage project is approximately 70% complete, largely due to cooperation with the weather and temperature. Work is presently being done on Floor 3 and the ramp between floor 3 and 4.
- ✓ The drain in the circular driveway has been replaced.
- ✓ The fire sprinkler system in the garage required repair to remove corroded pipes and replace them with new pipes and fittings.
- ✓ Daily cleaning and disinfecting is ongoing.

The budget has just been approved by a majority of the BoD and was sent out to shareholders. Due to the ongoing boiler and garage projects our reserves have been substantially reduced and a raise in maintenance of \$3 per share was approved by the board. This increase becomes effective on January 1, 2023, and a letter and a copy of the budget was sent out to shareholders.

A Tip to add some sparkle to the hallway. Our staff does a fine job keeping our hallways clean, but there are some things that are the responsibility of residents. One of those things is the marble door saddles by apartment doors. Over the years, they become dirty and grimy, unattractive to say the least. It takes only a few minutes and a little elbow grease to make those saddles shine. Maintenance Committee members suggest two ways to clean them easily and effectively. One is to use a Mr. Clean Magic Eraser. The second is to use a sponge with a little Comet and bleach. It is one small way each of us can play a part in making the Greystone a great place to live.

UNCLAIMED FUNDS WAITING AT NYS COMPTROLLER'S OFFICE

No, it is not a scam. Many have already collected from \$100 to thousands of dollars and there may be residents who are not aware that they have money/funds that they can claim. These monies are with the New York State Comptroller's Office. This money may come from unused gift certificates, refunds for returned items in retail stores or more significant amounts of money coming from unclaimed tax refunds, dividend funds, etc. In order to claim what is yours and get a check in the mail, you must Google – "New York State Comptroller – Unclaimed Funds". Enter your last and first name and any money in your name will be listed. You have to verify your address, checking to see if you have ever lived at the address listed, as there may be others with your same name, enter your info and you will get a check in the mail for the funds that have been unclaimed. When you file you will receive your money in as little as a week or two. If you find a deceased relative, it will take a little longer, as you need to provide a death certificate, etc. In any case, this money is yours, so don't hesitate to check this out. This notice is being repeated, as many have been afraid to apply, however this is legitimate. Maybe you will get a cash surprise to start 2023

GREYSTONE GARAGE PARKING STICKERS

"All residents who are assigned parking space(s) are required to have a valid parking sticker attached to the back of the rearview mirror of each car." If you do not have a sticker, please fill out a request form with the doorman and a new sticker will be issued to you. If, in the future, you replace your car with another it is your responsibility to transfer the sticker or to request a new sticker. Thank you for taking care of this matter.

Compactor Rooms

We live in community at the Greystone. So, in consideration of each other <u>*PLEASE*</u> do the following so we do not attract rodents, roaches or other critters when



disposing of our garbage. Your participation will be most appreciated.

- ✓ All garbage <u>MUST</u> be bagged and tied before putting into the chute. <u>PUSH</u> bagged garbage down the chute before closing the door.
- ✓ Please break down cereal boxes (Costco size) to put in the bin,
- ✓ Pizza boxes must be broken down and thrown down the chute.
- ✓ If you collect bottles and cans weekly/monthly put in a garbage bag and bring to the basement. If you place this large bag on top of the baskets the rest of your neighbors cannot dispose of their daily empty contains properly.
- ✓ Do not leave large items and large bags of plastic bottles in compactor room, place in the halls near the laundry rooms.

Driving through Garage

- ✓ Speed limit in garage is 10 MPH. It is very dangerous to speed through the garage. Please be considerate.
- Please enter any repairs that are needed into the work order book at the doorman's station so that we can quickly get the repairs completed.
- ✓ The mailboxes are small and fill up quickly. Please empty your mailboxes daily. If you are ill or cannot get to your mailbox, ask a neighbor or friend to get it or tell the doorman so that he can keep your mail until you can retrieve it. Many come through the lobby but don't bother to check the mail and this causes problems for the mail carrier.
