MONTHLY REPORTS TO THE COMMUNITY

Maintenance continues at The Greystone as follows....

- **Boiler Project** The wall restoration on the pool deck, Northside Boiler Room, has been completed to match the cinderblock and paint that is currently there. A fireproof door for emergency access and louvers for ventilation of the boiler room is also in process.
- Garage Project Waterproofing on the garage membrane on floors 3 and 4 was completed. Although there is still work to be completed in the garage, we hope that there won't be much need to move our parking spots in the future. Thank you

- again, Joel, for taking on the difficult task of organizing and supervising the garage at this time.
- Exterior Repairs Various repairs were made on the pool deck around the elevator bulkhead, and the coping stones and flashing were repaired on the roof.

 Additional exterior repairs will be made as needed.
- Carpet Cleaning All carpets were cleaned about two weeks ago, as is always done in the spring. Carpet cleaning regularly takes place in May/June and in Nov/Dec, twice a year.

MEMORIAL DAY HOLIDAY

We just celebrated Memorial Day on Monday and, of



course, we know Memorial Day for big department store sales, the unofficial start of the summer, BBQ's and picnics, etc. But, do you know the true meaning of this

Federal holiday?

Memorial Day is an American holiday that honors all soldiers who died during service to the nation. It originated during the Civil War era when citizens placed flowers on the graves of those who had been killed in battle. The holiday was declared a national holiday through an act of Congress in 1971. Unlike Veterans Day, Memorial Day honors all military members who have died while serving in U.S. forces. Memorial Day is commemorated at Arlington National Cemetery each year with a ceremony in which a small American flag is placed on each grave. Traditionally, the **President or Vice President** lays a wreath at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier. In addition, the flag is flown at half-staff and some even wear a red poppy on this day. Think about what this day really means and pause to think about all military members who have died in the service of our country.


May just ended and the garden is in bloom! We've got quite a variety of flowers, vegetables and herbs-- lots of basil and tomatoes, but also peas,
