# EUGENE, OUR LIFEGUARD, OUR HERO!

On Juneteenth, when the pool was busier than usual due to the holiday, our resident lifeguard, Eugene, saved a young girl from drowning. The girl was a guest who swam out to the deep end of the pool, with her friend, on a "noodle", lost her grip and went under. She came up and grasped for the "noodle" but it was out of reach. She was about to go under again when Eugene jumped in and rescued her. The girl was shaken, but fine. A tragedy was averted but this incident reminds us about the importance of following the rules and the lifeguard's directions, which are meant to keep us all safe.

Please remember that anyone who can't swim should stay in the shallow end of the pool. In addition, children under three who are not "potty" trained must wear swim diapers and use the kiddie pool. Actually, NO ONE WEARING A DIAPER should be using the pool. This is for the health and safety of all residents.

Last week, when a thunderstorm started, one of our lifeguards asked all to vacate the pool. This was met with resistance and, although the lifeguard explained that it was dangerous to be in a pool after hearing thunder and for 20 minutes after hearing the last clap of thunder, the residents wanted to re-enter the pool. Thunderstorms can be dangerous, especially near water AND PLUMBING, and it is important to abide by the lifeguard's directions.

We hope that all enjoy the pool and pool deck this season and continue to follow the rules that will keep everyone safe.

# *Our normal pool safety rules continue as follows....*

- Pool opens at 12:00 - 8:30 PM on weekdays 10:30 - 8:30 on weekends and holidays
  \*After August 11<sup>th</sup> pool will close at 8:00 PM
- No running in the pool area
- No diving or rough play in the pool
- No loud music on pool deck. Please use earphones.
- No glass anywhere on the pool deck.
- Parents must monitor their children in both the large pool and the Kiddie Pool.
- No inflation devices in the large pool.
- <u>NO</u> DIAPERS OF ANY KIND IN THE LARGE POOL
