LABOR DAY CELEBRATION!




On Sunday, our Labor Day celebration was one of the best events ever. Thank you to Joaquin Perojo and Brielle Berrios for constantly offering to



TRASH DISPOSAL- CLARIFICATION

In the August issue it was noted that no trash is to be left on the floor of the compactor rooms. ALL TRASH MUST BE THROWN DOWN THE COMPACTOR CHUTE! There is no excuse that "my bag was too large and did not fit into the chute". If you are using bags that are too large to fit through the chute you must use smaller bags. Do not bring bags of trash to the basement either. BAGS OF TRASH ARE NOT TO BE LEFT IN THE BASEMENT. We cannot have bags containing food waste left in the compactor room or in the basement to attract rodents and insects. Thank you in advance for your cooperation.

The Board of Directors has decided to keep our pool open, as weather permits, for your enjoyment.

It is important and Imperative to follow the below pool rules for a safe and enjoyable time on the pool deck.

- All gates will be open for pool access:
 Weekdays from 12 PM to 7 PM. Weekends 11 AM to 7 PM
 To enter, use the security code. (0327)
- Safety equipment will be left on the table next to the pool.
- After 7 PM, the 2 most westerly gates will stay open until 8:30 PM for BBQing. To enter, use the security code. (0327)

Weekdays there will be

"NO LIFEGUARD ON DUTY, SWIM AT YOUR OWN RISK"

(Lifeguards are present only on Weekends)

LIMITED HOURS: Weekdays 12:00 PM - 7:00 PM Weekends 11:00 AM - 7:00 PM

- •-CHILDREN UNDER THE AGE OF 16 MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY AN ADULT.
- - NO INDIVIDUAL IS PERMITTED TO BE IN THE POOL UNLESS ANOTHER ADULT IS ON THE POOL DECK.
- ANY VIOLATION WILL RESULT IN REVOCATION OF POOL PRIVILEGES.
