Here are some ways you can show vets that you appreciate the sacrifices they made....

- If you personally know a veteran (perhaps a relative, friend, or even a neighbor), reach out to them on Veterans Day with a phone call or visit! This is one opportunity to engage beyond just saying thank you. If they are comfortable discussing it, ask a vet where they served, where they were stationed, what specific jobs they did while serving, and so on.
- If you're not close to a veteran, write a thank you card and drop it off at a VA hospital.

Our fall garden event, "Monet in the Garden", turned out very well, after a rainy start. Fifteen residents contributed sketches of the garden that will go towards making a community collage. It was a fun day, and a lot of

us were happy to rediscover what a joy it is to sketch and paint! The collage is being finalized, and we hope to put it up in the community room soon. We also painted pumpkins and ate apple cider donuts - and altogether it was a lovely day.

We were so happy to showcase the garden for residents so they could enjoy the beauties of the garden and of nature in general. One of the best ways to destress is by getting outside and spending time in nature. As gardeners, we know that spending time outdoors, working with soil and plants, gives a sense of peace and tranquility. Now several scientific studies have provided data to back this up. One study from Nature magazine by Matthew P. White et al., shows that spending at least 120 minutes a week in nature can increase a person's sense of health and well-being. Another study from the Journal of Behavioral Science, by Alan Ewert and Yun Chang, showed that people who recreated in a natural environment had significantly lower levels of cortisol - the stress hormone - than those who recreated in an urban environment. Having high levels of cortisol for extended periods of time can lead to chronic stress, something that can wreak havoc on your body when left unchecked, leading to symptoms like fatigue, weight changes, high blood pressure and more. The next time you're feeling stressed out, consider taking a few minutes to step outside and go sit in the Greystone Garden to soak up some of nature's destressing vibes. Each season has beauty, and even in late autumn, the garden still has flowers in bloom and vegetables on the vine. There are also artworks and Halloween pumpkins scattered around as decoration as well. The garden will welcome you!

Planning for the following special events is now underway.



Reminders...

- ✓ When leaving for a day or even for a short vacation, please make sure that your thermostat is set at around 68 degrees. This will keep your apartment warm and make sure that there will be no problem of pipes freezing during your absence.
- ✓ It is very important that a labeled key to your apartment be left at the doorman's station to be locked in the office in case of an emergency that necessitates entry into your unit. There has

never been an incident at The Greystone where someone was able to take a key and enter an apartment without permission, BUT there have been incidents where it was necessary to enter an apartment due to a flood, leak or other situation, a resident falling or taken ill and not able to get to the door for emergency services, or a resident being locked out of a unit, necessitating drastic action. Please check that a working key is left with the doorman and, if one is not already there, make a copy, label it with your apartment number and leave it with the doorman as soon as possible

✓ Be mindful to drive slowly through the garage, residents have reports speeding and almost being hit walking up the ramp. 10 MPH limit.
