CINCO DE MAYO

Cinco de Mayo officially commemorates the anniversary of an early victory by Mexican forces over French forces in the Battle of Puebla on May 5, 1862. It is not the anniversary of the defeat and expulsion of the French forces by the Mexicans, which occurred in 1867. It is also not, as is often assumed, the day of Mexico's celebrations of independence, which are actually held on September 16. It is believed that the origins of Cinco de Mayo celebrations lie in the responses of Mexicans living in California in the 1860s to French rule in Mexico at that time. Cinco de Mayo is seen as a day to celebrate the culture, achievements and experiences of people with a Mexican background, who live in the United States. There is a large commercial element to the day, with businesses promoting Mexican services and goods, particularly food, drinks and music. Other aspects of the day center around traditional symbols of Mexican life, such as the Virgin de Guadalupe, and Mexican-Americans who have achieved fame, fortune and influence in the United States.

SPRING CLEANUP DAY

RCCY hosted its 5th annual neighborhood cleanup day on Sunday, April 27. The event started in the front of the Greystone. About 16 neighborhood residents received gloves, bags and trash pickers and cleaned up the streets and the train station. Many Greystone residents joined in the cleanup effort, and it took quite an effort, too, as the day was windy and cold. But neighborhood residents and one City Councilman, Anthony Merante, bagged up 6 large bags of garbage and some car parts for the Yonkers DPW to pick up. THINGS TO DO...

Spring is a perfect time to visit museums, as it is not too hot, nor too cold, and no heavy clothing is needed. One can walk through the museum feeling free and unencumbered. This is just a reminder that the Hastings on Hudson Public Library has free museum passes for an entire family that can be borrowed. These passes will get a family admission to many museums in NYC,

Westchester and surrounding areas. The museums included are The Guggenheim, Frick, Intrepid, The New York Historical, and The Museum of the City of New York, as well as the 911 Museum and Memorial in Manhattan. There is also The Museum of the Moving Image in Astoria, NY. There are also passes to The Hudson River Museum, Katonah Museum of Art, Storm King Art Center in New Windsor, Franklin Roosevelt Library and Museum in Hyde Park, Magazzino Italian Art in Cold Spring, Stone Barns Center in Pocantico Hills, Neuberger Museum of Art in Purchase, Westchester Children's Museum in Rye, The Greenburgh Nature Center in Scarsdale and Mohonk Preserve in Gardiner. NY. All you need is a Westchester County library card to reserve a pass. What a wonderful and interesting way to spend a spring day and admission is free! Take advantage of this great opportunity with family or friends.
